



Curaçao International Airport, Hato

Project Summary

The airport is located at the northwest end of Curaçao, about 6 km from the capital Willemstad. It has services to the Caribbean region, South American cities, North America and Europe. Curaçao International Airport is a fairly large facility with the second longest commercial runway in the Caribbean. The airport's strategic location, about 40 miles north of Venezuela, offers competitive advantages for transshipment / storage of goods and fuel supply as well as transit services for transatlantic flights to and from the Caribbean and the Latin American market in general.

The newly designed airport terminal is operational since July 1st, 2006. It is based on an initial capacity of 1.6 million passengers per year, expandable to 2.5 million passengers.

Since 2009, A-port S.A. is the majority shareholder of Curaçao Airport Partners N.V. (CAP) and holds 51% of the shares of this company, which is the concessionaire and operator of the airport. Minority Partner with 49% is the Dutch construction group Janssen de Jong. A-port Operaciones signed an O&M-Agreement for the operation of the airport, including the right to appoint the CEO and the COO.

Milestones

- 01 August 2003 Start of the 30-year concession, led by Alterra Partners
- 01 July 2006 Startup of the new passenger terminal building
- 29 January 2009 Acquisition of the majority share from Alterra Partners by A-port S.A.
- 01 May 2009 New CEO Albert Brunner in charge
